## MORTGAGE BURNING SERVICE

**Pastor**: Our help is in the Name of the Lord, who has made heaven and earth. Blessed be our God, who does all things well.

The presiding minister traces the inscription on the Paschal Candle to mark a new Easter season's beginning.

Christ, yesterday and today, the beginning and the ending. To Christ belongs all time and all the ages; to Christ belongs glory and dominion now and forever. **Amen.** 

The presiding minister lights the paschal candle and sings the lighting refrain:





The People join in the refrain and walk in a procession around the church. As they walk, a flame is passed from the Paschal candle to all of the candles in procession. After they come to pass the bonfire again, they pause at the North door to hear the Easter proclamation.

Exult, all creation around God's throne!


Jesus Christ is risen!

It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that with full devotion of heart and mind and voice we should praise the invisible God, and the only Son, Jesus Christ our Lord; who by his precious blood, redeemed us from bondage to the ancient sin. For this indeed is the Paschal Feast in which the true Lamb is slain, by whose blood the doorposts of the faithful are made holy.



in which, in ancient times, you delivered our forebears, the children of Israel, and led them, dry shod, through the sea. in which the darkness of sin has been purged away by the rising brightness.



in which all who believe in Christ are rescued from evil and the gloom of sin, are renewed in grace, and are restored in holiness. in which, breaking the chains of death Christ arises from hell in triumph. O night truly blessed which alone was worthy to know the time and hour in which Christ arouse again from hell!



Of which it is written: The night is as clear as the day," and, "then shall my night be turned into day.".

The holiness of this night puts to flight the deeds of wickedness; washes away sin; restores innocence to the fallen,

and joy to those who mourn; casts out hate; brings peace; and humbles earthly pride.

Therefore, in this night of grace, receive, O God, our praise and thanksgiving for the light of the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, reflected in the burning of this candle.

We sing the glories of this pillar of fire, the brightness of which is not diminished even when its light is divided and borrowed. For it is fed by the melting wax which the bees, your servants, have made for the substance of this candle.



In which heaven and earth are joined—things human and things divine.

We, therefore, pray to you, O God, that this candle, burning to the honor of your name, will continue to vanquish the darkness of night and be mingled with the lights of heaven.

May Christ the Morning Star find it burning, that Morning Star who never sets, that Morning Star who, rising from the grave, faithfully sheds light on the whole human race.

And we pray, O God, rule, govern, and preserve with your continual protection your whole church, giving us peace in this time of our paschal rejoicing; through the same Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit now and forever.

Christ will come again.






If you are unable to come forward, please let one of the ushers know so that communion can be brought to you. After receiving the bread and wine or blessing, it is customary to say "Amen."












would include camp fun and a river-rafting excursion. We would fundraise to off-set costs to families. Is this something your teens would be interested in?
